Dr. Catherine Riley is a Clinical Assistant Professor of Pediatrics in the University of Arizona, Department of Pediatrics. She completed a fellowship in developmental behavioral pediatrics at The Children's Hospital of Philadelphia. She has been here in Arizona for 5 years. She teaches in the UA medical school in both the basic science and the clinical medical curricula. The majority of her time is spent clinically evaluating and diagnosing children with developmental and behavioral concerns (especially autism). Dr. Riley is the program director for the Developmental Behavioral Pediatric Fellowship. She is a member of the board, along with being the leader of the professional advisory committee for the Autism Society of Southern Arizona.
