Dr. Holenarasipur Vikram is a Professor of Medicine at the Mayo Clinic Alix School of Medicine and Medical Director of Transplant Infectious Diseases at Mayo Clinic Arizona. With over 20 years of clinical experience, he specializes in managing complex infections in transplant recipients, including donor-derived infections and fungal diseases like coccidioidomycosis. He has led and published research on infections such as West Nile Virus, COVID-19, HHV-8, and others in transplant settings, including some of the largest published cohorts on brain abscess and neuroinvasive WNV. Dr. Vikram has held several leadership roles at Mayo Clinic, including Vice-Chair of Infectious Diseases and founding Program Director of the Infectious Diseases Fellowship. A dedicated educator, he has received numerous honors, including the 2019 Keith A. Kelly Distinguished Educator Award and induction into the Mayo Clinic Academy of Educational Excellence. He is a Fellow of the ACP and IDSA, and a member of several national transplant and infectious disease societies. His research focuses on infections in immunocompromised hosts, donor-derived diseases, invasive fungal infections, and cardiovascular infections.
