Dr. Danielle Avila attended Colorado State University on a track and field scholarship where she earned her B.S. in Biologic Sciences followed by M.S. in Biomedical Sciences. She then attended medical school at Universidad Autonoma de Guadalajara, in Mexico, where she learned to speak Spanish. This was followed by Internal Medicine residency training in her home state at Billings Clinic, in Montana. She completed infectious diseases fellowship in June of 2020, and then joined the University of Arizona as a clinical assistant professor of medicine. Her research and academic interests center around treating infections in vulnerable populations, including people who inject drugs, infective endocarditis and HIV.

His clinical interests include cardiovascular disease prevention, cardiac electrophysiology, and providing patient-centered care.
